Dr. Anver M. Emon offers a jurisprudential and comparative argument about law, jurisprudence, and history to illustrate how detailed understanding of the conceptual vocabulary of Islamic law can offer creative space for dialogue about law and religion in the public sphere.

Dr. Anver M. Emon specializes in premodern and modern Islamic law and legal history. He is the founding editor of *Middle East Law and Governance: An Interdisciplinary Journal* and is the acting director of Religion in the Public Sphere, an interdisciplinary academic initiative at the University of Toronto. He received his BA from UC Berkeley; JD, UCLA School of Law; MA, University of Texas; LLM, Yale Law School; and PhD from UCLA Department of History.
