			Ethics is a required course for UB Law. In this fully online offering,			
			students will explore the ethical standards and legal obligations of			
			lawyers, as well as learn lawyering skills (such as interviewing, counseling,			
			and negotiating) in the context of professional practice. Based on the ABA			
			Model Rules, this course will also use MPRE-based quizzes every unit to			
			reinforce the lessons and prepare students for that exam. We will explore			
			the Professional Conduct Rules and the Restatement (Third) of the Law			
			Governing Lawyers, as well as New York rules, statutes, and case law			
			which govern lawyer behavior and the lawyer's duties, supplemented by
